INTRODUCTION

This Summer, Humber Street Gallery becomes **Hull Television Workshop** (HTW), influenced by Sesame Workshop, the American non-profit organisation that produced Sesame Street.

Over the course of the exhibition, contemporary artist **Harold Offeh** will be facilitating workshops in the Gallery with three Hull based community groups to co-create HTW episodes. In the TV Screening Room we invite audiences to view this video content alongside an introductory film produced by Offeh. New films will be added to the showreel throughout summer and we encourage you to return to the Gallery to view them. Like Sesame Street, designed to help low-income families prepare for school, HTW will have a strong social purpose. Each episode's focus will be led by people in Hull for people in Hull. HTW will screen a variety of programmes, which may include animations, talk shows, documentaries or music shows.

This is a developing live exhibition, with planned workshop activity which enables locals to be creative whilst learning new skills. As the Gallery is transformed into a space of production and creativity, we invite local artists and creatives to use the space outside of planned workshops to hot desk alongside one another, connect and collaborate. ABOUT THE ARTIST

Harold Offeh (b. 1977, Ghana) lives and works in Cambridge and London. Offeh has exhibited widely including at Tate Britain and Tate Modern, South London Gallery, Turf Projects, Kettle's Yard, Wysing Art Centre, Studio Museum Harlem, MAC VAL, France, Kunsthal Charlottenborg, Denmark, Museum of African Diaspora, San Francisco, and Art Tower Mito. Offeh is Reader in Fine Art at Leeds Beckett University and a Visiting Tutor at the Royal College of Art and Goldsmiths College. In 2019 he was a recipient of the Paul Hamlyn Foundation Award for Artists, the largest award of its kind in the UK.

Offeh is an artist working across performance, video, photography, learning and social arts practice. He is interested in the space created by the inhabiting or embodying of histories. He employs humour as a means to confront the viewer with historical narratives and contemporary culture, grappling with issues such as colonialism, the dynamics of work, labour and gender, and ideals of masculine power.

Creative Connections with Artlink Hull

Creative Connections is an open access adult group allowing Disabled communities to explore creative processes and improve wellbeing. The programme has been operating since March 2019, and historically partners local artists with disabled individuals with the aim of offering support, promoting creativity and wellbeing, amplifying their voices, giving them a sense of community and motivation, and combating isolation.


The Warren Youth Project

Welcome to English


