EXHIBITION TEXT

BOOTLEG SHREG & FRIENDS is an exhibition at Humber Street Gallery featuring newly commissioned works by Bruce Asbestos. The exhibition is an invitation for you to enter into the world of 'Shreg' and explore the many facets of this fun and fascinating character. Asbestos' artistic approach uses playfulness as a way of generating absurd and fun combinations of objects and images, setting up unique relationships between disparate elements of personal and cultural identity.

The exhibition at Humber Street Gallery comprises three spaces for the creation of a new character: 'Shreg', a bootlegged version of the popular film character known and loved by many. Bruce Asbestos invites you to assemble the new character in Space 1, on your own or with friends, out of various facial lime green inflatable shapes and features. In Space 2, you can make your own version of 'Shreg' using plasticine and check up on Bruce's sculptural homework, seeing the combination of different famous green characters from pop culture.

'Schräg' is a German word that loosely translates as weird, fishy or skewed. We hope that our exhibition also has these *vibes*, our 'Shreg' is a celebration of everyone who feels like an outsider.

Through a series of unique artworks, the exhibition explores the concept of a new character combining the best qualities of widely recognisable green cartoon characters from popular culture, including Shrek, Yoda, the Grinch, Yoshi, and Luigi. BOOTLEG SHREG & FRIENDS is a love letter to a cast of unusual and wonky green characters who use their strength, wisdom, love of adventure, sharp wit, or unwavering determination to overcome challenges and protect those they care about. Overall, BOOTLEG SHREG & FRIENDS is an exciting and imaginative exhibition that creates a brand-new character in a fresh and thought-provoking way. Visitors to the exhibition will be treated to a variety of mediums, including interactive inflatables, paintings, sculptures, and mixed media pieces.

ABOUT THE ARTIST

Bruce Asbestos' work draws from a rich history of painting, sculpture, popular culture, folklore and fairy tales. His work frequently mixes everyday objects with high art, fashion, and responds to global pop culture. His interdisciplinary practice combines performance, painting, clothing, social media, video games, curating and many collaborations.

Witty, seductive, and extravagant; Asbestos' work feels at once both unique yet strangely familiar. His playful use of popular culture, commerce and high art puts his own personal brand firmly within the realm of participation, play and pop art. The work uses spaces such as social media, the catwalk, and virtual realities to create an accessible path through contemporary art. The works increasingly use play as a way of generating absurd, idiosyncratic combinations of objects and images, setting up problematic relationships between disparate elements of personal, cultural identity, fantasy and our collective relationship with commerce. Particularly, the work looks to make sense of the idea of national and regional identity, given we are increasingly exposed to a shared global pop culture, and prompts audiences to reflect on their own cultural experience.
