Creative Connections Artists with Jennifer Holtridge and Juneau Projects

EXHIBITION TEXT

Perches and Flyways is a new exhibition commissioned by Humber Street Gallery and produced by Creative Connections; an ongoing series of workshops run by Artlink Hull which provides disabled communities opportunity to explore creative processes and improve wellbeing.

Working with artist Jennifer Holtridge and artist-duo Juneau Projects, the participants have created a collection of ceramic bird sculptures focusing on species which live in or near The Humber. At a time when environmental pressures mean a number of species who have visited the location in the past, including the Night Heron, the Shelduck and Ringed Plover, are now in decline; the exhibition draws attention to the importance of celebrating wildlife local to us.

This project has been developed and delivered in collaboration with Artlink Hull.

ABOUT JUNEAU PROJECTS

Juneau Projects was formed in 2001 by Philip Duckworth and Ben Sadler. Their work is made in collaboration with other people, ranging from one-off workshops that introduce people to a skill or technique to long term projects working with communities to create artworks for their area. They work across a broad range of media including sculpture, animation, print making, Riso printing, performance, music and public art. They are interested in the urge people have to be creative, how that has manifested throughout history and how we can work with groups to create work together.

Juneau Projects have exhibited at venues including Tate Britain (London), PSI (USA), Frankfurter Kunstverein (Frankfurt), Grizedale Arts (Cumbria), IKON (Birmingham), Echigo-Tsumari Art Triennale (Japan), Tatton Park Biennial (UK), Somerset House - Kings Cultural Institute/Up Projects (London), Lismore Castle Arts (Ireland) & Two Chairs, Vermont (USA).

SCULPTING, FIRING, GLAZING

The ceramic birds in this exhibition were made over hot mugs of tea and sugary doughnuts across a series of six workshops. At the workshops, artists from Creative Connections met with Juneau Projects (Phil and Ben) who are an artist duo that collaborate with people to make artworks.

Creative Connections is an ongoing project, produced by Artlink Hull, which provides disabled communities with opportunities to engage in arts and making. For these workshops Phil and Ben worked with residents of Victoria House, a purpose-built centre providing accommodation and support for people with complex needs, and the Open Access Creative Connections group who meet once a fortnight.

Flicking through textbooks with titles like "Birds of Hull and the Local Area', everyone became familiar with many species including the Avocet, Shelduck, Little Tern and, every East Yorkshire local's favorite winged friend, the Puffin. Over the course of these sessions, Ceramicist Jen Holtridge guided everyone through the process of sculpting a bird of their choosing in clay. Once every wing, beak and tail feather was carefully shaped it was time for the first firing. Firing is a process which brings ceramics up to high temperatures to make them durable. Next, colour. Glazes of sky blue, scarlet, pink, Bittern brown, and the gold of a Plover were mixed and painted on to the ceramics bringing the birds to life before one last firing. Once ready, the delicate sculptures are hung on the wall of the gallery, where you see them today, expressing the variety and diversity of East Yorkshire's more-than-human residents. But it wasn't all bird and clay chat, there was singing along to the radio, "what are you up to at the weekend"s, dad jokes from Ben and lots of laughter...mainly from Shirley. Whilst hands were busy making new connections, friendships and interests were formed, which are just as integral to this project as the work you see on the walls.
