LIVE LIKE LEGENDS

19 JULY - 22 SEPTEMBER 2024 SPACE 1 AND 2

EXHIBITION TEXT

Live Like Legends is a bold and compelling celebration of Hull's Street Art and graffiti scene. Taking place across two floors at Humber Street Gallery, the exhibition explores some of the joys and complexities of this unique form of public expression which has had a striking presence in the urban landscape of Hull since the early 1980s.

Bringing together many generations of artists who have made critical contributions to the development of this vibrant and far-reaching cultural scene over the past forty years, Like Like Legends presents newly commissioned artworks highlighting the diversity of creative practice within this artistic community.

Working collaboratively, the artists and an eclectic mix of contributors celebrate self-expression through highly stylised graffiti and multimedia work, alongside curated archival material including photography and previously unseen footage. This important cultural archive provides context to how the graffiti scene intersects with other aspects of street and youth culture, and alongside society more broadly.

Coming together to both celebrate and unpick a creative artform which has long been defined by its existence outside of gallery walls, the artists in this exhibition reveal the conditions which allowed the scene to thrive in a post-industrial Hull. Live Like Legends situates work created by artists cross-generationally within a broader, international culture.

Exploring the colourful and rich histories of Hull's Graffiti & Street Art scenes, Space 2 presents an installation of projected films and archival material. Combining photography, printed material, zines, rave flyers, sketches, and paste-ups into a visual tapestry reflective of the cultural mash-up and DIY approach that allowed Hull's underground & often subversive culture to thrive. Also included in this space is work created by the artists over a weekend in early July. Influenced by the community spirit and energy of 'Graff Jams' - festivals where graffiti artists transform public walls and spaces with new work the weekend brought together artists from across generations to create their work collectively in the space.

A new soundscape commission by DJ and sound artist Kev Le Kat explores Hull's eclectic underground music history, featuring sounds from Pork Recordings, ENF, and spoken word from artist K148.

In true graffiti fashion, these works are displayed on the walls, painted and sprayed on wood, and pasted up, reflecting the style and flair of a worldwide cultural phenomenon that was taking hold in major cities like New York and Paris at the same time as it was in Hull.

Included in this exhibition is work by Detour, Ekoe, K148, Kev Le Kat, Leebo, Lonny POP, mike sprout, Mr Joe, NoHone, OBOUT, Oman, Paris, Pesh, Pinky, SI2, Skeg, Sophie Cash, Spamdog, Vrok, Xenz, Yours and Ziml.

Live Like Legends is co-curated by Absolutely Cultured, Paris, Pinky, and mike sprout.



FLOORPLAN



FILM SCREENING: STYLE WARS & HEARTLANDS THURSDAY 1 AUGUST 2024 7-9PM HUMBER STREET GALLERY PAY WHAT YOU CAN, BOOKING REQUIRED

Style Wars is regarded as the indispensable document of New York Street culture of the early '80s, the filmic record of a golden age of youthful creativity that exploded into the world from a city in crisis.

Style Wars captured the look and feel of New York's ramshackle subway system as graffiti writers' public playground, battleground and spectacular artistic canvas. Opposing them by every means possible were Mayor Edward Koch, the police, and the New York Transit Authority. Meanwhile MCs, DJs and B-boys rocked the city with new sounds and new moves and street corner breakdance battles evolved into performance art.
